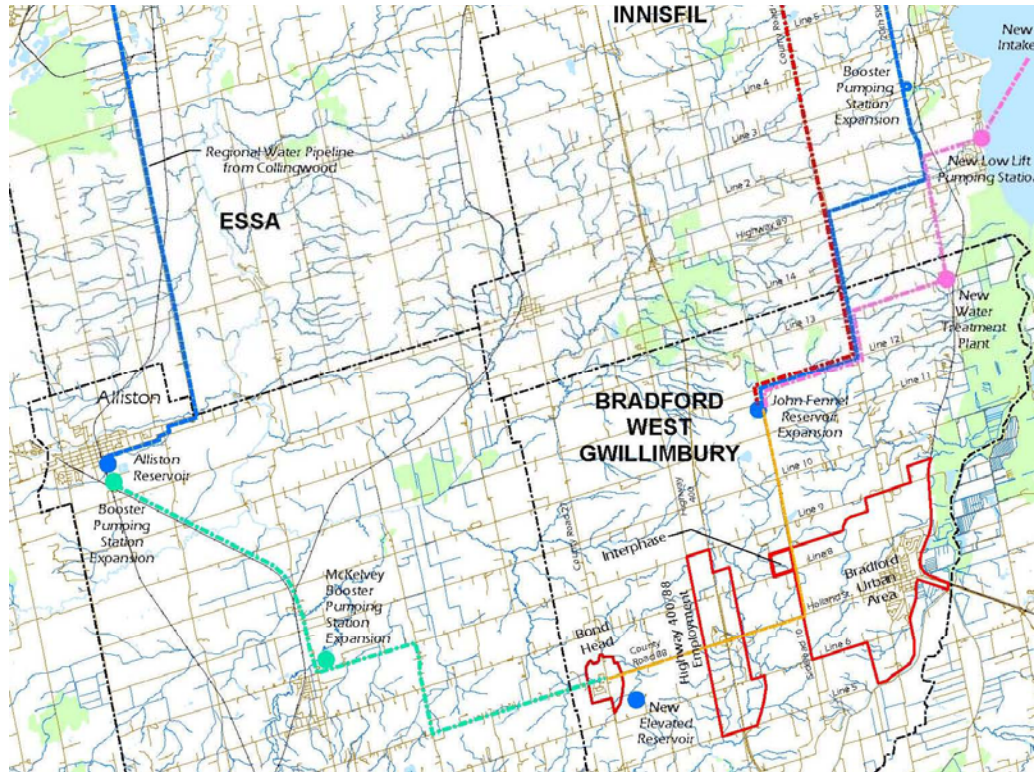


Water Supply & Wastewater Servicing Master Plan Update

Client: Town of Bradford West Gwillimbury

SERVICES PROVIDED

CCTA updated the Bradford West Gwillimbury Water Supply and Wastewater Servicing Master Plan under the Municipal Class EA. The purpose was to identify the preferred means of increasing the water supply and wastewater servicing capacity for the Town's planned growth. It involved the assessment of numerous water supply scenarios including extending current arrangements with the Town of Innisfil, and obtaining water from adjacent municipalities such as Barrie and New Tecumseth. Alternatives for increasing wastewater servicing capacity considered potential constraints from the Lake Simcoe Protection Plan and the Phosphorus Reduction Strategy, which were under development during the study. A Liaison Committee comprised of the Ministry of the Environment, the County of Simcoe, the Lake Simcoe Region Conservation Authority, and developers provided valuable input. It was recommended Bradford West Gwillimbury supplement its groundwater supplies with additional treated water from the Town of Innisfil, and expand its Bradford Water Pollution Control Plant while increasing the level of treatment for phosphorus removal.

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
